

**Dr. Robert D. Rowley Memorial Scholarship  
For the Scholastic Year 2010/2011**

**Description**

The scholarship program is administered by Two Rivers Bank & Trust Investment Services, 222 N. Main St., P.O. Box 728, Burlington, IA 52601. Scholarships may be awarded to students actively engaged in study in any field of healthcare at one of three prescribed post-secondary schools. Study in a vocational or technical healthcare field qualifies the student for consideration. But study in a preparatory field, such as pre-med or pre-dental, does not. The amount of each scholarship grant is determined by the scholarship committee, but will generally be in the \$500 to \$2,000 range. The scholarship committee determines the number of grants that will be made each year. The committee ordinarily will make two to four grants per year. A student may receive the scholarship more than once, but it is not automatically renewed. A previous recipient must file another application to be given consideration.

**Eligibility**

To be eligible a student must attend one of the following schools: Southeastern (Iowa) Community College, Iowa Wesleyan College or the University of Iowa; and must have resided in or attended secondary school in one of the following Iowa counties: Des Moines County, Lee County, Henry County or Louisa County. In addition the student must be actively engaged in full-time study in a healthcare field for the term for which financial assistance is being sought.

**Application**

An application must be made on the form provided by the scholarship committee. The forms will be available at each school's financial aid office, or can be obtained by contacting Two Rivers Bank & Trust Investment Services at 319-753-9132, or by e-mail at [jwalz@tworiversbank.com](mailto:jwalz@tworiversbank.com). The due date for the application is April 30, 2010. The completed application must be submitted by the due date to Two Rivers Bank & Trust Investment Services.

**Selection Criteria**

The primary consideration for selection is need for assistance in paying the cost of post-secondary education in a healthcare field. However, the committee will inquire into and take into account other information that bears on a student's prospects for successful completion of the course of study, and the student's commitment to a career in healthcare.

**Grants**

The committee will select recipients of the scholarship grants on or before May 15, 2010. Recipients will be notified. The grants must be paid directly to the recipients' schools. Each grant is payable in two or more installments, one installment for each term in the school year. For example, if there were two semesters in the year, one-half of the grant would be paid at the beginning of each semester. Recipients must submit a transcript of grades at the end of each term to show satisfactory progress before the next installment will be disbursed. If a recipient discontinues study in a healthcare field, the grant will be cancelled. A recipient who receives any portion of a grant while he or she is not in compliance with the conditions for receipt of the grant must refund the money to the scholarship fund.
